- Literacy/Numeracy Intervention update
- HIGHLIGHTS OF THE GREAT WORK WE ARE DOING HERE AT EPS (taken from the info previously sent to parents regarding the BTPS Learning Guide) Edgerton Public School's whole-school learning focus is on increasing literacy and numeracy skills across grade levels. Through these efforts, we hope that students will exhibit strong literacy, numeracy, communication skills, and inclusive attitudes to be productive global citizens. In our efforts to achieve this desired state, we are currently delivering weekly guided reading groups (Grades 3-9) to support reading comprehension strategies, multiple blocks of levelled literacy intervention

(Grades 1-6), math support blocks (Grades 10-12), and weekly readalouds to support literacy in all subject-matter areas (ECS-Grade 12).

Looking toward the second semester, we will be adding guided numeracy

groups to our weekly rotation (Grades 3-9). We are utilizing resources such as STAR Reading, Fountas and Pinnell's Levelled Literacy Intervention System, Heggerty's Phonemic Awareness Curriculum, Mathology, and IXL in both universal and targeted contexts to build capacity and strengthen our school's literacy and numeracy skills.

• ALBERTA EDUCATION ASSURANCE SURVEY (formerly Accountability Pillar Survey) Parents/Guardians of students in Grades 4-12 will receive a survey package mailed by Alberta Education that includes a random access code to complete the survey online.
